After graduating in Rome in 1957, Portoghesi became one of the first architects to pit himself against functional rationalism both with his studies on Guarino Guarini and Francesco Borromini, and the surprising Casa Baldi in Rome (1959), where he united the Avant-Garde and Baroque styles. His Rome Mosque (1975–1993) is the high point of his research. He was the curator of the First Venice Architecture Biennial, (1980) and director of the Strada Novissima installation. Portoghesi is one of the key characters in the post modern movement.

He has been the director of the magazines Controspazio, Eupalino, Materia and Abitare la Terra as well as having taught at the School of Architecture of Rome and Milan, where he was also Dean from 1968 to 1977.
